Federal Funds and Grants to Support Professional Development

ESSER/GEER

Provide professional development to educators on research-based strategies for meeting students' academic, college, career and future readiness needs

- COVID response funding
- \$191 billion in formula funding
- Obligation deadline September 30, 2023 (ESSER II); September 30, 2024 (ESSER III)

Title IIA

Providing professional development for teachers and principals

- Yearly funding provided through ESEA grants
- \$2.2 billion in formula funding
- Obligation deadline September 30, 2024

IDEA

Encouraging and supporting the training of special education and regular education teachers and administrators to effectively use and integrate technology

- Yearly funding provided through the Department of Education
- \$13.3 billion in formula funding
- Obligation deadline September 30, 2024

Perkins/CTE

Professional development costs

- Yearly funding provided through the Department of Education
- \$2.1 billion in formula funding
- Obligation deadline September 30, 2024

Potential Use of Federal Funds

Live Professional Development

- Onsite: 1 day, 6–7 hours; multiple topics for multiple audiences
- Synchronous virtual: 3-hour increments; multiple topics for multiple audiences

On-demand Professional Development Platform

 Online: Library of more than 800 synchronous and asynchronous sessions; content includes instructional best practices, content-specific lessons, digital citizenship and STEM

Custom Professional Development Conferences and Academies

 Synchronous virtual or onsite: 1–3 days; content can be customized to meet your needs, including multiple topics, instructional technology coaching, product–specific content and preparation for instructional technology certifications
